ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

N.K.T. National College of Education for Women was established in the year 1966, which is at the heart of the city of Chennai. Our College is housed in an area of 3.06 acres, where a model school is also situated. It has metamorphosed into a well established, urban College catering to the teacher educational needs of women from all sections of society. The College offers graduate, post graduate, research and doctorate in Education with Autonomous status awarded by the University Grants Commission in the year 1988. With thirty three years of autonomy, the College has grown upright to great heights as an institution of higher learning in Education. In its continuous striving for excellence over five decades in achieving position 'Second to None', the institution has been successful. Though the challenges and constraints were many, the College has been upgrading its courses on par with the expectations of the society. In endeavouring to attain excellence in Teacher Education, the College has achieved great strides in the academic ladder by upgrading into a post graduate institution in the year 1980, into a research centre in 1983 and by attaining the autonomous status in 1988. The Autonomous status of the College provides great scope for enhancement and enrichment of academics in multifarious directions.

The introduction of peer team evaluation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council enables all academic bodies to periodically assess their progress in comparison with similar institutions. This evaluation is a feedback to the institutions aspiring for betterment in Education. N.K.T. National College of Education for Women has also fallen in line with regard to NAAC peer team evaluation and was awarded a five star status in the first cycle in the year 2001 and awarded A Grade with CGPA of 3.26 on a 4.00 point scale in the second cycle during the year 2011. The College, in this 55th year of its existence, with 33 years of autonomy, remains fully aware and committed to its mission of empowering young women student teachers to face life and its multifarious challenges at both personal and professional levels. To this end, it renews its commitment to maintain quality in Teacher Education, participating in the process of nation building, working for social change and ensuring justice and equity in all aspects of its educational mission, which facilitates our institution to acquire reputation for excellence, inclusiveness and committed service to the teaching community.

2. No periodicals or reference books shall be taken out of the library.
3. Silence must be observed strictly in the library.
4. Every student teacher shall pay Rs.25/- as caution deposit which will entitle her to take six books on loan at a time.
5. Readers are advised not to write upon, damage or make any marks on any books belonging to the library.
6. Readers shall be responsible for any damage done to the books or other properties belonging to the library and shall be required to replace such books or other properties damaged or pay the value thereof along with penalty as per the library norms. If one book of a set is damaged or lost the whole set must be replaced.
7. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library.

7. While teaching in a class, a student-teacher must always stand well in front of the class so as to have full view of her pupils. She shall not, except when marking the attendance register or doing similar work in conjunction with the class, be seated.
8. All student-teachers shall ensure a clean black board surface before she commences her lessons.
9. She shall note the standard, section and the subject at the top of the black board.
10. When writing on the black board, she shall stand in such a position so as not to conceal what she is writing.
11. She shall allow time for the pupils to copy whatever she may require them to copy from the black board and shall not permit this copying while she is teaching.
12. She shall try to avoid all kinds of mannerisms as far as possible.
13. She shall try to learn the name of the pupils in the class taught.
14. She shall participate in all the activities of the school.
15. She shall volunteer to help the schools by correcting pupils' exercise, by attending to the routine matters of the class allotted to her and by

participating in the activities of the class such as conducting assemblies, citizenship activities and projects.

Code of Conduct for Teaching Faculty Members

1. Every Teacher shall discharge his/her duties efficiently and diligently to match with the academic standards and performance norms laid down by the College Management from time to time.
2. Every Teacher shall update his/her knowledge and skills to equip himself/herself professionally for the proper discharge of duties assigned to him/her.
3. Every Teacher shall conduct himself/herself with absolute dignity and decorum in his/her dealing with the superiors, colleagues and students every time.
4. No Teacher shall absent himself/herself from duties at any time without prior permission from higher-ups.
5. No Teacher shall accept any honorary or other assignment given to him/her by any external agency without the prior permission of the College Management.

7. She shall try to avoid all kinds of mannerisms as far as possible.
8. The teacher shall try to learn the name of the pupils in the class taught.

Duties of an apprentice teacher: Each apprentice teacher should regard herself as fully subjected to disciplinary regulations of the school where she is apprenticed. She should participate in all the activities of the school.

She should regard the teacher under whom she is apprenticed as her guide. She should discuss with her the notes of lesson, lesson procedure, use of aids etc. in respect of the classes she will take up.

She should volunteer to help the schools by correcting pupils exercise, by attending to the routine matters of the class allotted to her and by participating in the activities of the class such as conducting assemblies, citizenship activities and projects.

At the end of each day, each student teacher must give an account of her experience to her supervising teacher i.e. the teacher under whom she is apprenticed and make appropriate entries in her diary or in her note book, of the salient features of such discussions.

In short, during the period of apprenticeship, the apprentice gets a full and complete exercise of the art of teaching. She should preserve all the charts and other aids she had prepared during her practice teaching phase.
