ABOUT OUR FOUNDER

Our Founder, Thiru. N.K. Thirumalachariar, who lead humankind toward excellence through his untiring educational efforts, was responsible for starting the National Training College for Women, at present termed as the N.K.T. National College of Education for Women.

Born on September 17th 1895, in a small village of Thirunelveli District, he became a lawyer and was admitted to the Bar in the year 1919. He had an inborn inclination for public service, which was realised through his educational service.

The present N.K.T. National Girls' Higher Secondary School was started by him as an Elementary School in the year 1941, which soon grew to become a Middle School, a High School and a Higher Secondary School.

In order to produce efficient teachers he started the N.K.T. National Training College for Women in the year 1966. Ever since its inception, the College is doing extraordinarily well, winning honors year after year. Over a period of 56 years, the College has expanded and enriched the scope of trained teachers.

The secret of his success in the field of educational service was the tremendous amount of conviction he had in love, service, sacrifice, charity and piety. These institutions are ever indebted to him for their present status.

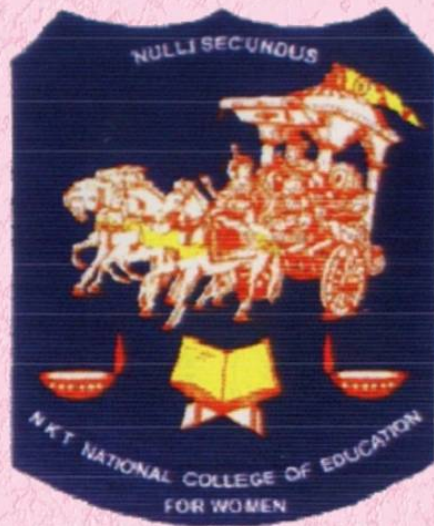

ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

N.K.T. National College of Education for Women was established in the year 1966, which is at the heart of the city of Chennai. Our College is housed in an area of 3.06 acres, where a model school is also situated. It has metamorphosed into a well established, urban College catering to the teacher educational needs of women from all sections of society. The College offers graduate, post graduate, research and doctorate in Education with Autonomous status awarded by the University Grants Commission in the year 1988. With thirty four years of autonomy, the College has grown upright to great heights as an institution of higher learning in Education. In its continuous striving for excellence over five decades in achieving position 'Second to None', the institution has been successful. Though the challenges and constraints were many, the College has been upgrading its courses on par with the expectations of the society. In endeavouring to attain excellence in Teacher Education, the College has achieved great strides in the academic ladder by upgrading into a post graduate institution in the year 1980, into a research centre in 1983 and by attaining the autonomous status in 1988. The Autonomous status of the College provides great scope for enhancement and enrichment of academics in multifarious directions.

The introduction of peer team evaluation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council enables all academic bodies to periodically assess their progress in comparison with similar institutions. This evaluation is a feedback to the institutions aspiring for betterment in Education. N.K.T. National College of Education for Women has also fallen in line with regard to NAAC peer team evaluation and was awarded a five star status in the first cycle in the year 2001 and awarded A Grade with CGPA of 3.26 on a 4.00 point scale in the second cycle during the year 2011. The College, in this 56th year of its existence, with 34 years of autonomy, remains fully aware and committed to its mission of empowering young women students teachers to face life and its multifarious challenges at both personal and professional levels. To this end, it renews its commitment to maintain quality in Teacher Education, participating in the process of nation building, working for social change and ensuring justice and equity in all aspects of its educational mission, which facilitates our institution to acquire reputation for excellence, inclusiveness and committed service to the teaching community.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE COLLEGE

1966

- Inception of the National Training College for Women (now called as N.K.T. National College of Education for Women) with the strength of 80.

1967

- Foundation stone for Kamala Nehru Hostel laid down by then Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru in 1952 was dedicated to the N. K. Thirumalachariar National Training College for Women.

1969

- Permanent Affiliation status was accorded to the National Training College for Women by the University of Madras.

1972

- B.T. Course was renamed as B.Ed. Course.

1973

- The University of Madras granted approval to our former Principal Late Dr. Suseela Kumari Vyas to guide Ph.D. Scholars in Education.

1980

- M.Ed. Course was introduced with the affiliation of the University of Madras.

1983

- Ph.D. Degree in Education was introduced with the affiliation of the University of Madras.
- Post Graduate Status was awarded to our College by the Directorate of Collegiate Education and University of Madras in consideration of the introduction of M.Ed. and Ph.D. Courses.

1986

- The strength of B.Ed. Course was increased to 90.

1987

- Introduction of the optional “Elements of Economics” at the B.Ed. level with the affiliation of the University of Madras which was inaugurated by Late Sri. C.R. Pattabiraman (Bar-at-law) former Union Minister, Ministry of Law and Company Affairs and President, Sriman. N. K. Thirumalachariar National Education Society
- The strength of the B.Ed. Course was increased to 120.
- Implementation of the Project on “Learning Disabilities” under College Humanities and Social Sciences Improvement Programmes (COHSSIP) (sponsored by UGC - VII Five Year Plan) was inaugurated by Dr. P.S. Balasubramanian, Professor and Head, Department of Education, University of Madras.
- Introduction of the National Service Scheme.

1988

- Confirmation of Autonomy to the College by the University of Madras, Government of Tamil Nadu and University Grants Commission.
- Inauguration of the Psychology Laboratory by Hon’ble Sri Motilal Vora, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.
- Introduction of “Computer Education” as an optional with the affiliation of the University of Madras which was inaugurated by Dr. A. Gnanam, the then Vice- Chancellor, University of Madras.
- The strength of the B.Ed. and M.Ed. Courses were increased to 145 and 9 respectively.
- Dr. Suseela Kumari Vyas, Principal of our College was elected as Syndicate Member of University of Madras for one term.

1989

- Introduction of the optional “Mass Communication” at the B.Ed. level, which was inaugurated by Thiru. V. Sankara Subbaiyan I.A.S., Former Commissioner and Secretary, Department of Education, Government of Tamil Nadu.
- The B.Ed. Course strength was increased to 167.

- Introduction of the M.Phil. Course (with an intake of 4) with the affiliation of the University of Madras was inaugurated by Dr. H.B.N. Shetty, I.A.S., then Special Commissioner and Secretary, Department of Education, Government of Tamil Nadu.

1990

- The UGC funded an Institutional Project on Remedial Measures for Health and Population Education.

1991

- The strength of the B.Ed., M.Ed., and M.Phil. Courses was increased to 200, 15 and 6 respectively.

1992

- Celebration of the Silver Jubilee of the College in the august presence of His Excellency Hon'ble Thiru. Bhishma Narain Singh, then Governor of Tamil Nadu.
- In commemoration of this function, an Audio Visual laboratory was constructed and inaugurated by His Excellency.

1993

- Introduction of Non-credit Courses.
- State Award for the Best Teacher was conferred on our former Model School Headmistress and our Alumnae Smt. C. Chellammal.
- Dr. Suseela Kumari Vyas, then Principal, Dr. Andal Raghavan, then Reader and Dr. Shanthi Promod, then Senior Scale Lecturer visited Stockholm Institute of Education, Sweden, as a visiting faculty.

1994

- Approval was granted by the University of Madras to Dr. Shanthi Promod to guide Ph.D. Scholars in Education.

1998

- Centenary Jubilee celebration of our founder Thiru N. K. Thirumala chariar in the august presence of His Excellency Late Thiru. R. Venkatraman, former President of India. His Excellency

unveiled the founder's statue, released the souvenir and distributed mementos to the staff.

1999

- Introduction of Elective Courses at B.Ed. level.

2000

- Introduction of Yoga Training for the B.Ed. and M.Ed. Students.
- Dr. Shanthi Promod, then Principal and Dr. S. Vasanthi, then Reader visited Stockholm Institute of Education, Sweden as visiting faculty.

2001

- College was accredited by NAAC with Five Star status.
- Introduction of the optional 'Integrated Education for the Visually Impaired' at the B.Ed. Level.
- Introduction of Intel Computer Training Programme for both Faculty Members and Students at all levels.

2002

- Approval was granted by University of Madras to Dr. Thilaka Suresh, the then reader in Biology to guide Ph.D. Scholars in Education.

ATTENDANCE

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamilnadu Teachers Education University should gain Attendance Norms of Tamilnadu Teachers Education University of B.Ed. i.e. 85% attendance in general or 75% attendance on medical grounds and 90% of attendance during School Internship in every semester. For theory course students who could not comply with the above stated norms in any semester be permitted to re-do the B.Ed. Programme for the particular semester provided that the annual intake of students strength should not exceed the strength of 200 as sanctioned by the NCTE (within the course duration of 3 years as per the NCTE norms) from the 2018-19 Batch of students onwards.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

5. Readers are advised not to write upon, damage or make any marks on any books belonging to the library.
6. Readers shall be responsible for any damage done to the books or other properties belonging to the library and shall be required to replace such books or other properties damaged or pay the value thereof along with penalty as per the library norms. If one book of a set is damaged or lost the whole set must be replaced.
7. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library.

Code of Conduct for Students

1. All students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline at all times in the College campus.
2. Every student must register her Biometric Attendance on arrival and departure.

10. Every Teacher, should at all times, strive for academic excellence in the discharge of her/his duties and conduct herself/himself in a manner for all to emulate.
11. The College Management may, at its sole discretion, provide an opportunity to the faculty member for presenting her/his case through a personal hearing before taking a final decision. The decision of the College Management will be deemed final and binding and will not be subject to any appeal to any individual or forum.

Code of Conduct for the Employees in the College

1. Every Staff employed in the College shall discharge her/his duties efficiently and diligently and shall conform to the rules and regulations of the College.
2. No Staff employed in the College shall absent herself/himself from her/his duties without prior permission from her/his authorities. In the event of a medical emergency, however, a medical certificate to the satisfaction of the College authorities shall be produced within a week of taking leave.
3. No Staff employed in the College shall engage directly or indirectly in any trade or business. In the case of remunerative work, specific sanction of the College authorities, in writing, shall be obtained.
4. No Staff employed in the College shall send any application for employment to any other agency, except through the Secretary of the College.

5. The relieving order of the Staff shall be open to the College Committee and they can decide on the same.
6. When a Staff employed in the College, seeks to accept honorary work without detriment to her/his duties, prior permission of the Secretary, in writing, should be obtained.
7. A Staff employed in the College, when involved in criminal proceedings, should inform the committee of such proceedings.
8. No Staff employed in the College, shall engage herself/himself in any political activity. She/He shall not associate with any political party or any organization which takes part in politics or subscribe to, or assist in any other manner, any political movement.
9. No Staff employed in the College shall contest or participate in or canvas for any candidate in any election.
10. No Staff employed in the College shall bring or attempt to bring any political or other influence on her/his superior authority in respect of her/his individual service interests.
11. No Staff employed in the College shall engage herself/himself, nor participate in any activity which is anti-secular or prejudicial to the Sovereignty and Integrity of India, or that which involves contempt of court, defamation or incitement to an offence.
12. No Staff employed in the College shall indulge in any criticism of the policies of the Government either directly or indirectly or participate in activities which bring disrespect to the Government.

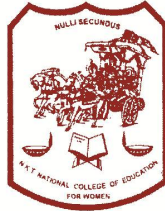
